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# Labour Standards - OH & S Code Changes Effective June 1, 2018

Labour Standards changes are coming in on June 1, 2018. Here is what you need to know:

#### **Youth Labour Standard Changes:**

Youth 12 Years Old & Under:

- May only be employed in an artistic endeavor.
- Can only be employed under the conditions of a permit issued to the employer by the Director of Employment Standards.
- Hours of work restrictions will be determined during the approval process. If school is in session, the employee can't work later than 9 pm on a weeknight and 11 pm if the next day is a weekend day.

Youth 13 - 15 Years Old: May be employed in:

- Any job that is deemed to be light work.
- An artistic Endeavour.
- Any other type of work authorized under a permit issued by the Director of Employment Standards that is not considered hazardous work (the permit application must include the consent of a parent, guardian or other person who has the lawful care, custody or control of the person seeking employment)

Youth 16 - 17 Years Old:

- who work in retail or hospitality have the following restrictions on hours of work:
  - o can only work between 9 pm and 12 am **with** adult supervision
  - o can't work between 12:01 am and 6 am
- Employees between the ages 16 and 17 who work in **jobs that are not in retail or hospitality** have the following restrictions on hours of work:
  - can only work between 12:01 am and 6 am with parent/guardian consent **and** adult supervision

# **National Industrial Symbiosis Program**

The National Industrial Symbiosis Program is a business to business network that identifies for resource collaboration, thereby creating economic, environmental and social benefits to businesses and surrounding communities.

The principal behind industrial symbiosis is quite simple: instead of being thrown away or destroyed, surplus resources generated by industrial process are captured then redirected for use as a 'new' input into another process by one or more other companies, providing a mutual benefit or symbiosis. These mutually profitable links are not restricted to materials, they include resources such as; energy, wastewater, transportation, asset utilization and even expertise.

This helps link waste from one process as feedstock for another. This results in virgin materials being substituted by 'wastes' and transforms them into valuable products. Reduces business costs, diversifies revenue streams, and fosters innovation. Strengthens business competitiveness and financial position and by generating new business opportunities.

# Minimum Wage Increase Effective October 1, 2018

Effective October 1, 2018, minimum wage in Alberta will increase to \$ 15/hr from \$ 13.60. Here are a few things you will need to know:

- Employers must pay at least the minimum wage.
- Minimum wage is the same for adults, liquor servers, adolescents, youth and disabled people.
- Wages don't include tips or expense money.
- There are separate weekly and monthly minimum wages for some salespersons and domestic employees.
- Employees must be paid at least 3 hours of pay at the minimum wage each time they go to work even if they're sent home after less than 3 hours, unless the employee is not available to work the 3 hours. There are some exceptions to this rule for employees in the Employment Standards Regulation (Part2, Section 11) or where a variance has been issued.
- Maximum deductions below minimum wage for provided meals and lodging are \$3.35 per consumed meal and \$4.41 per day's lodging.
